by Aneta Schloemer

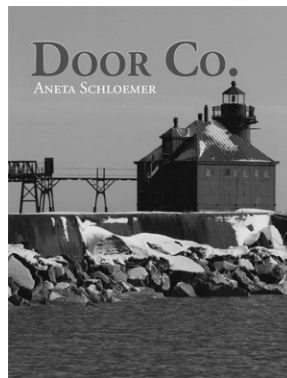
A caver am I,

The quilt has quilted hearts and stippling in the outside white border. The quilt was donated by Bettie Greenwood of Aylett, VA. It will be displayed at this year's Love Fest, and the raffle is planned for May — Mental Health Month.

Working full time and raising 4 children never allowed Bettie the luxury of pursuing her passion for quilting until 2004 when all of her kids had graduated from college. Since then she has machine pieced and quilted over 60 quilts with the majority of them being bed size. After having made quilts for many friends and relatives, donating quilts to charities has become a focus.

She is involved in three different quilt groups and has made and donated quilts to many non profit organizations. Her quilts have gone to battered women's shelters, meals on wheels recipients, for pets, senior citizen day care groups, police departments to give to children in traumatic situations, churches, and the current project of providing quilts for all hospitalized veterans in the local VA Hospital for Christmas.




